

VICTORIAN CIVIL & ADMINISTRATIVE TRIBUNAL (VCAT) Your Appeal Rights

If you have lodged a Freedom of Information (FOI) Internal Review Request with Mercy Health and you are not satisfied with the final outcome, you may appeal to the Victorian Civil & Administrative Tribunal (VCAT) to review that decision.

What is VCAT?

VCAT is a tribunal established to deal with disputes about various issues and includes hearing appeals against decisions made in FOI Cases. VCAT provides a more informal forum than the court system for citizens to bring an appeal to be heard.

Am I eligible to contact VCAT?

You are eligible to contact VCAT in the following circumstances:

- When the department has taken longer than the 45 day legislative requirement to provide you with a
 decision to your request. This is known as a 'deemed refusal'. In this instance you may lodge a VCAT
 application immediately after the 45 day period has elapsed
- If you requested an internal review and were not satisfied with the decision.

Applications for VCAT must be made within 60 days after you receive notice of the Internal Review decision.

If you think that you have grounds for an appeal, contact VCAT for advice as to how to proceed.
